City Update: Road Construction Projects

The Lake Saint Louis Department of Public Works is pleased to share an update about ongoing projects that are under construction within the city. Here's a look at what's happening.

Hawk Ridge Trail and Ronald Reagan Drive Improvement Project

Construction Schedule: In Progress

Project includes resurfacing Hawk Ridge Trail (from Ridgeway Dr. to Hwy N) and Ronald Reagan Drive (from Hwy 64 to Hwy N), and replacing adjacent sidewalks, curb ramps, and entrance approaches that are not ADA compliant.

Lake Saint Louis Flashing Yellow Arrow Conversion and Signal Upgrade Project

Project Schedule: 2023-2024

In an effort to reduce vehicle delays and improve intersection safety, this project will implement flashing yellow arrows and signal upgrades at the following intersections: Ronald Reagan Drive/Lila Lane, Ronald Reagan Drive/Hawk Ridge Trail, Technology Drive/Lake Saint Louis Boulevard, Technology Drive/Meadows Circle, and Lake Saint Louis Boulevard/Henke Road.

Lake Saint Louis Boulevard Improvement Project - Phase 3

Construction Schedule: 2023-2024

This is the third and final phase of reconstructing Lake Saint Louis Boulevard between Interstate 64 and Peruque Creek Spillway.

Municipal Election April 2, 2024

The first day of candidate filing opens at 8 A.M. on Tuesday, December 5, 2023. Candidate filing will remain open between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 5 P.M., Monday - Friday, from December 6 to December 26, on days that city offices are open. Only those names of candidates received by 5 P.M. on December 26, 2023, shall be placed on the ballot.

Snow Parking Reminder

City code prohibits parking on all city streets when there has been any accumulation of snow, ice or other frozen precipitation. Vehicles that remain parked on city streets once precipitation begins will be subject to tow.

Project includes milling the existing pavement and replacing with asphalt pavement. Additional improvements to address safety involve adding turn-lanes at Bent Oak Drive and Bent Oak Cutoff, and profile correction at Rue De Paix to increase sight line visibility.

Annual Concrete Replacement Program

Construction Schedule: Completed Nov. 2023
Project consists of replacing deteriorated concrete slabs on Fairways Oaks Drive, Forest Knoll Circle, Forest Park Circle, Moorings Drive, Northmoor Circle, Park Hill Circle, and Ravenwood Court, and replacing sidewalks on Braemar Parkway and Braeswick Drive.

Old Highway N - Phase 2 and Phase 3

Construction Schedule: 2024
Project will extend Old Highway N from Hawk Ridge Trail to Old Forester Drive. Traffic signals will be constructed at the intersections of Old Highway N/Hawk Ridge Trail and Old Highway N/Sommers Road. This project is under design and will go out to bid in December 2023.

North Henke Road Improvement Project

Construction Schedule: 2024
Project will resurface North Henke Road and provide widening at the sharp curves in the roadway. This project is in the final design phase.

Uptown Sidewalk Improvement Project

Construction Schedule: 2024
Project will consist of the reconstruction/construction of new sidewalk facilities and resurfacing of Lake Saint Louis Boulevard, from Veterans Memorial Parkway to the Spillway Bridge. This project is in the right-of-way acquisition phase.

Community Safety

Holiday Theft Prevention

Credit and debit card skimming occurs when thieves make an illegal copy of your card to make unauthorized purchases with your account, using your funds. Most skimmer devices are small, portable, and unnoticeable to the untrained eye. Always check for skimming devices and never use a device that appears altered.

Child Car Seat Check

The LSLPD provides free car seat checks by a certified child passenger safety technician. The technician can check to make sure your car seats are installed correctly and will teach you how to use and install a car seat on your own. Prescription Drug Drop Box

The LSLPD partners with the Missouri Prescription Pill & Drug Disposal Program (P2D2) to provide citizens the opportunity to dispose of unwanted or unused medications from their homes. A disposal box is located in the Police Department Lobby at City Hall (200 Civic Center Dr.) and is accessible 24 hours a day.

Trash Tote Storage ORDINANCE UPDATE

The Board of Aldermen recently approved a new trash tote storage ordinance to allow for more storage options without the additional cost of having to build a trash screen.

FORMER RULE

Under the old ordinance, property owners were not allowed to have their trash totes visible from any angle from the street, which meant that trash totes could not be stored on the side of the house without a screen.

NEW RULE

The new ordinance specifies that trash totes cannot be visible from the point on the street/curb directly in front of the house. This allows property owners to store their trash totes on the side of the house, as long as the containers are not visible while standing at the street/curb directly in front of the house.
